The Presentation of the Lord (Year A)

1st & 2nd February 2020

Dear Friends,

Forty days after the celebration of Christmas, the Church celebrates the presentation of Jesus in the temple. In many places this feast is marked by processions with lighted candles, reminding us that Jesus is the light who has come into the world. Ten weeks from now we will gather in our darkened church and greet the light of the risen Christ as the Easter candle spreads its light into every corner of the building and fills our hearts with joy. Light is such a powerful symbol. It can represent knowledge – we speak of being kept in the dark; of seeing the light. It allows us to see and appreciate the beauty of the world around us. Light guide us; lead us; show us the way. When Mary and Joseph brought Jesus into the Temple, Simeon recognized Him as the light of the world; he saw that Jesus was the one who would bring the light of knowledge, of freedom and of truth to all peoples. Jesus also calls each one of us to be light to the world. To shine in the darkness and give light to the lives of those we meet, those in whose lives we share. Today our crib is put away, just as Jesus after His presentation entered the hidden years of His childhood in Nazareth. We continue with Him the journey from the crib to the cross. But we never forget that at the end of this journey is the dazzling light of the resurrection, the light that can never be put out. Let us pray that we will always shine with the light of Christ in our darkened world.
