### Fifth Sunday Of Lent (Year A)

28<sup>th</sup> & 29<sup>th</sup> March 2020

Dear Friends,

Nothing in our lifetime has ever affected the whole world as the Coronavirus (Covid - 19). All countries have shut down, virtually all school and colleges have sent their students home. We are encouraged to stay at home in order to protect the NHS and save lives.

None of the specific reasons for leaving home concur with the visiting of a church for solitary prayer. As Bishop Alan said, "Keeping churches open sends an inconsistent message and therefore they must be closed for the benefit of others and stopping infection. This decision will be painful and difficult for many. But I believe it is now essential". Fr. Joseph and I offer the Mass every morning at 9am for the intentions on the newsletter and for the parish to be protected at this time. On this Sunday 29<sup>th</sup> March 2020, England will be rededicated as the 'Dowry of Mary'. We have been saying the Angelus every day in preparation for this event. Please join with me at 11.30 in your homes as we rededicate our Country to the Dowry of Mary in this time of crisis. You will find a PDF document beside the newsletter containing the prayer. There is also a reflection inside the newsletter on the virus that you might find helpful and hopeful.
