**Sixth Sunday of Easter (Year A)**

**16<sup>th</sup> & 17<sup>th</sup> May 2020**

Dear Friends,

In this month of Mary, we celebrate the Virgin Mary and her role in the history of salvation. Last Wednesday, 13<sup>th</sup> May we celebrated the feast of Our Lady of Fatima. On this Sunday, we would normally have had a procession in honour of Our Lady but this year we are unable due to the lockdown of Covid-19.

In England, devotion to Our Lady has been a major feature of Catholic life for centuries, with many shrines dedicated to her. Pilgrims have visited the shrine at Walsingham for almost 1000 years. In 1251, Our Lady appeared to St Simon Stock at Aylesford in Kent, giving him the Brown Scapular, which is worn by millions of the faithful worldwide. Some of our past Monarchs have also had a deep love for the Blessed Mother and turned to her in times of need - St Edward the Confessor (reigned 1042-1066) named England Mary's 'dowry', and King Richard II (reigned 1377-1399) consecrated the country to her protection. This year on the 29<sup>th</sup> March the Country was rededicated as "The Dowry of Mary" In preparation for this we prayed the Angelus, recalling as it does, 'some essential moments in the History of Salvation, reminding us of Mary's 'yes' to the Angel Gabriel, which undid Eve's 'no' in the Garden of Eden'. Catholics honour Mary because, full of grace, she cooperated with God's will and freely consented to bring Our Lord Jesus Christ into the world. On the cross, Jesus gave His mother to all of us, and now in heaven, she is a powerful advocate with her Divine Son. We love her because He loves her, and we can be confident that she will help us in our needs and difficulties, and lead us ever closer to Him. At this time with Covid19, we seek her protection and prayers to free us from this pandemic that affects all of us.

**Reflection from Bishop Alan on family life**

You won't be surprised to know that we've taken the decision not to hold a Mass this year in July as originally planned, and I hope those who would have come this year will be able to come next year instead.

This week is National Marriage Week and I would like to take this opportunity to send my greetings to all married couples, especially those celebrating significant anniversaries this year, and all those who are preparing for marriage. We have recently celebrated the World Day of Prayer for Vocations, and the church is greatly enriched by all those who live the vocation to marriage, helping their spouse and their children on the path to heaven and revealing something of Christ's love for his church through their own commitment to each other. You are all in my prayers, but most especially those who are experiencing illness and bereavement. I am also aware of the deep disappointment experienced by the many engaged couples who have had to postpone weddings or do not yet know how their weddings will be affected, and you too are in my prayers at this time of uncertainty.

Many families will be under a great deal of pressure with all the additional stresses associated with the pandemic, and sadly some relationships will be pushed to breaking point: please do not be afraid to seek help, or leave it too late – Marriage Care is one of a number of organisations offering remote access to marriage counselling, and in our own diocese the Brentwood Catholic Children's Society continues to provide vital support to children and families who are experiencing difficulties. As Pope Francis recently tweeted, "The Family is the hope of the future. Let us pray especially for families facing serious difficulties: may Our Lord assist them."
