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### Fifth Sunday of Easter (Year A)

Dear Friends,

This Sunday’s first reading tells us of the selection and ordination of the first deacons. Whatever their role was originally intended to be, very soon afterwards the Church was hit by a severe persecution. Stephen was killed – the Church’s first martyr – and the others were scattered. We hear of Philip teaching and preaching in foreign lands; of the remaining five, we know very little. They trusted in the Lord and went wherever He would lead them. Deacons today serve in a wide range of roles. Some find themselves on the front line – as medical and care staff, for example, or as chaplains in hospital or in prisons. Many others, like the people they serve, are locked down, isolated. Life no longer goes on as normal, and the future seems uncertain, just as it does for everyone. As a deacon in lockdown, sharing in Mass only through my computer screen, trying to keep some normality in abnormal times, I have become acutely aware of a sense of sacred time; of setting aside moments in the day when I know others will be at prayer, and being united with them, though physically separate. We are all adapting to new times, new ways, and for many of us we are trying to find our way while dealing with the grief of loss, or anxiety for those we love. In Sunday’s Gospel Jesus reminds us that the way through all this is to trust in Him, and through that trust to find the One who is Himself the Way. Please continue to pray for me, as I do each day for you.
