Dear Friends,

Leprosy is a disease, which has affect mankind for thousands of years. It is much less prevalent now because of modern medicine, but can still be found in parts of South America, Africa and India. It causes damage to the skin, nerves, limbs and eyes, and is still a social stigma: sufferers can be excluded from their societies, and must live in isolation in leper colonies.

In the Gospel, we hear a few times of Jesus coming into contact with lepers.

This particular man in today's Gospel reading came to Jesus on his knees, pleading, 'if you want to, you can cure me.' This leper must have felt totally isolated. The first reading, from the book of Leviticus tells us how lepers were excluded, and had to cry 'unclean, unclean!' if anyone approached them. In addition to the physical pain, they were also despised and feared by the people of the day.

Jesus understood the leper's isolation. They were isolated not because of anything they themselves had done, but because of their illness. Any form of isolation is an unpleasant experience, because there is a longing in every human heart to belong. This man had reached rock bottom; he had nobody, and in desperation, comes to Jesus on his knees. Jesus does not hesitate for a moment – he reaches out and heals the man.

The message in the Gospel gives us hope, because Jesus sees into the depths of our hearts, and knows how we can be wounded by exclusion and the fear of rejection. Just like the leper, we too turn to Jesus to be touched by his healing love and forgiveness. During this time of the pandemic, we pray for those who feel isolated and alone, we keep them in our prayers, thoughts and in our love.
