**Twenty-Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time (Year B)**  
**18<sup>th</sup> & 19<sup>th</sup> September 2021**

Dear Friends,

In the Gospel today, which follows on from the account we heard last week, Jesus again tells His disciples that he must suffer, die and rise again. But they still do not understand. Jesus tries to prepare them for the difficult days ahead in Jerusalem and yet they are wrapped up in their own world, seeking power and prestige. They argue amongst themselves over who is the greatest, like a group of little children arguing over who is whose best friend. Jesus asks them what they are arguing about, and they respond with the silence of shame. He now teaches them an important lesson, 'if anyone wants to be first, he must make himself last of all and servant of all' What does it mean to be a servant? To be a servant means to seek the good of the other person, not to control them for our own ends.

The sacrifices made by front line health care workers during the coronavirus pandemic were an inspiration to many. They put themselves at risk to care for the sick and some of them died.

Achievement, affirmation, recognition and status are attractive and enjoyable when they come our way, yet we can be in trouble if, like the disciples, we become caught up in the pursuit of them. Jesus tells them that true greatness lies in service of others. The call of the Gospel is to break out of self-absorption, to put aside our own desires and truly place ourselves at the service of others, for the sake of the Kingdom of God. We do not want to be contaminated by the values of the world, but we do want to be the salt of the earth and the light of the world; in other words, to show the world where true greatness is found.
