**Sixth Sunday of Easter (Year C)**  
**21st & 22nd May 2022**

We live in a world that says more is better. But today's first reading, which recounts a controversy in the early church, reminds us that sometimes less is better. The sides are lined up against each other. Jewish Christians who wanted Gentile converts to adopt Jewish religious practices. Others, including Paul, strongly disagreed, saying God did not want unnecessary burdens on anyone. Their opinions prevailed.

'Unnecessary burdens' the very phrase implies that some burdens are necessary. While it's more true to speak of God's commitment to us, rather than our dedication to God, religious faith does place some necessary burdens. The call to fidelity in prayer, acting justly, loving tenderly, becoming selfless rather than selfish are prime examples.

However, some burdens are unnecessary and arise out of fear, guilt, or mistrust of God. There can be a layer of superstition under-lying any religious faith. We should pray to be freed from the burdens of our own making in order to bear generously the genuine burden of Christian loving.

**PRAYER**

As we thankfully remember the gift of the Lord Jesus in this celebration of our life as Church, we embrace the love, peace, and hope that we share as members of this community. May we allow the Spirit to guide our lives and direct our decisions during the coming week. May our community continue to be light and hope for our world.
