## Dear Friends

In all the accounts of the Transfiguration we are told that Jesus took Peter, James and John up a high mountain. There He showed them His glory, and the Father identified Him as Son, just as He had spoken when Jesus was baptised.

Mountains are important places in the Scriptures. They are places where God is often most closely encountered. They are places of refuge from the hustle and bustle of the world, and where we can see further and more clearly. So many of the important events in the Gospels – the temptation of Jesus, the Sermon on the Mount, the agony in the garden, the crucifixion – take place on the heights. St John of the Cross drew parallels between the Christian life and climbing a mountain. Only when we reach the summit will we see the face of God. On the way we will pass through darkness, difficulties, and fears. From time to time, we will fall. But we will also experience moments of joy, peace, and clarity of vision.

Faith teaches us the way up and keeps us on a safe path. As Christians, we are called to aspire to higher things; to climb the mountain that leads us to God. It will not always be easy; few things of value ever are. But we do not travel alone. Jesus invites us, as He invited Peter, James and John, to climb the mountain with Him. For St Teresa Benedicta, this ascent is like Christ carrying His cross to the mount of Calvary. Our crosses are easier to bear because He is with us carrying His own. Then when we reach th of our lives, we, too, will see God face to face and be called to share in glory with Him for all eternity.
