Dear Friends,

Many of us can picture the oil lamp. It was found in so many houses around the country before electricity came. There was a ritual almost in lighting the lamp on a winters evening, making sure that the match didn't touched the mantle, pumping up the oil to the right level to give a bright light, which filled the whole kitchen. With electrification, all it took was a flick of a switch, to give an even better light. However, many people held on to the old oil lamp and a drop of oil so that they would be ready when the electricity went off. There it stood, dusty and unused in some household corner, ready for an emergency.

Sometimes the gift of faith is treated in a similar fashion. Keeping faith in God or faith in people is not an easy thing to do. Something happens to us that doesn't fit into our understanding or expectation. The flame of faith can reduce to an ember. We can put it aside, like something from the past that no longer fits our life. Come a crisis and we fly to where we left it, but it's too weak to warm or light our path and there's no one to turn to.

It's a bit like that in today's Gospel. Be ready is the advice, hold on to some oil for the lamp. Be ready, for the Lord is coming and sometimes He comes in the dark. Keep your lamp trimmed and burning.
