Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time (B) 6th & 7th July 2024

Dear Friends,

In today's Gospel, Jesus has returned to his hometown of Nazareth and follows His usual custom of teaching in the synagogue on the Sabbath. On other occasions we see Him working many great miracles, but here He only cures a few sick people. On this occasion, the people of Nazareth, his own people, reject Him, and He is amazed at their lack of faith. They would have known Jesus as He grew up, and perhaps their familiarity with Him blinds them to His true identity. Hence their astonishment; they say, "Where did the man get all this?" We too must avoid the same trap. Perhaps we are acquainted with Jesus in some sense, but fail to recognise His divine presence, especially in the Holy Eucharist, in the bread and wine that will become His Body and Blood? It is not enough to know of Jesus, we must actually know Him and give our lives to Him. This requires faith on our part. Faith is the virtue which most moves and affects the heart of Jesus. When He sees someone with faith, He always responds. Think of the numerous times in the Gospels when we hear, "Go your faith has saved you" or similar words which commend faith. Likewise, He challenges those who have no faith, "When the Son of Man appears, will He find any faith on earth?" He wept over Jerusalem, because of the people's lack of faith. Our personal weaknesses can be an obstacle to our faith. Like St Paul in the second reading, we will probably recognise a "thorn in the flesh", in ourselves, something persistent, which pulls us down and can discourage us. We might feel desperate to be rid of it, whatever it is for us, as St Paul was (he prayed for it to be taken away many times). But the Lord revealed to him that His grace is sufficient, and that His power is at best in weakness. The lesson for us is that we should be conscious of our weaknesses, because they prevent us from becoming inflated with pride. Paul could have taken pride in his apostolic position, as if his talents entitled him to it. In point of fact, none of us is 'entitled' to anything; all we have is a gift from God. Knowing our weaknesses should rouse faith in us, drawing us into the covenant relationship with God, trusting that His power will work through our weaknesses.
