### Thought for the week:

We need, in the church today, to recapture devotion to the real and abiding presence of Christ in the Eucharist. Outside Mass that presence continues and is celebrated through devotion and prayer before the Blessed Sacrament of the Altar. Belief in the reality of Christ's presence in the Blessed Sacrament does not come from reading; it does not come from thinking. It does not come from any person's skill. It comes from faith, from the humility of mind to accept and to say 'yes' to what many seem to be unbelievable, namely that the Body and Blood of Christ are present under the appearance of bread and wine. How important is the precious moment when we receive Our Lord in Holy Communion. It is the moment when we give ourselves to him, as he gives himself to us; a moment when he will speak to us in his own way and encourage us. It is a very personal time and should not be rushed or invaded by distraction. Moments of silence and stillness after Communion are important, moments before the final prayer and blessing, and after, when we stay behind in church – alone with him. – Cardinal Basil Hume

#### Is the Assisted Suicide Bill about Compassion, Giving Choice and Dignity?

The Catholic Union,with Church of the Immaculate Conception, Farm Street, London, is hosting a panel discussion on Kim Leadbeater's Assisted Dying Bill **on Sunday 24**November at 3.00pm.

Baroness Hollins, President of the Catholic Union, says: "There is insufficient scrutiny and consultation of Kim Leadbeater's Bill, which is concerning on several levels, but especially in this attempt to move doctors out of their primary duty to care for patients and towards participation in what will soon, if the bill is passed, become a new UK business sector of euthanasia provision. This panel discussion will help inform the debate and unpick how compassion, giving choice and dignity are concepts that are not synonymous with assisted suicide".

Panellists include: Baroness Tanni Grey-Thompson DBE DL, paralympic athlete and advocate for disability rights; Dr Matthew Doré, Consultant Palliative Care Physician; Professor Julian Hughes, Former Consultant Old Age Psychiatrist; Professor David Albert Jones, Professor of Bioethics. The event, which will be followed by a Q&A, is free to attend but <a href="mailto:booking">booking</a> is required.
