Dear friends.

This Monday, we begin a new month, and a new school year opens up before us. With every new beginning comes an opportunity to reflect on the person that you and I are now, and on the person that God is calling us to become.

The readings today speak about humility. Humility is so important in living out the Christian life. It is the virtue which keeps us grounded, preventing both an overinflated ego on one hand, and living out of poor self-esteem on the other. Mother Teresa said that humility is the mother of all virtues. She said, 'it is in being humble that our love becomes real. If you are humble nothing will touch you, neither praise nor disgrace, because you know who you are. If you are blamed, you will not be discouraged. If they call you a saint, you will not put yourself on a pedestal.'

Real humility gives us the freedom to think not of ourselves, and our own interests, but of others. It leads us to service. In the service of God, we cannot be looking for personal gain. That is why Jesus mentions the poor, crippled, blind and lame – none of whom is able to pay us back. We should serve others simply for their sake, and for the sake of the Kingdom.
