Thought for the week: Cardinal Newman, Doctor of the Church

Pope Leo XIV has announced his intention to declare St John Henry Newman a Doctor of the Universal Church. This title of doctor of the Church is rarely bestowed and recognises the exceptional contribution that St John Henry made to theological research and reflection. It puts him into the company of the greatest teachers of the Church, such as St Augustine, St Thomas Aquinas, St Teresa of Avila, St Therese of Lisieux and others, now totalling just 38 in all.

St John Henry has a very special connection with Dublin, having lived and worked from 181 – 1858 as the first Rector of the Catholic University of Ireland, the forerunner of today's University College Dublin. It was here in Dublin that he delivered the famous lectures on university education, later published as the Idea of a University. The beautiful University Church on St Stephen's Green was also built on his initiative. St John Henry Newman, pray that the people of Ireland will treasure the faith that has been passed on to them.

Twenty Third Sunday in Ordinary Time (Year C)

6th & 7th September 2025

Dear friends,

The Gospel today calls us to check out how our discipleship is being lived. Is God centre-stage in my life? In my Parish?

The reading presents us with a series of sayings on what the demands of a life of discipleship involves in terms of suffering and self-sacrifice. The life to be lead and the conditions laid down are anything but easy: you give God everything and hold nothing back. Whole-hearted service is demanded and there is no room for compromise. The price to be paid is the heavy burden of the cross. 'To be a follower is to be discipline in the ways of Jesus.

It is an active decision to get to know Jesus better. This is not going to come cheap. It comes at a cost. Dietrich Bonhoeffer in his book 'The Cost of Discipleship' says that cheap grace is grace without the cross. Discipleship will make demands. It will demand our time, our possessions, our energy and our true selves. As our Gospel points out today, it could make demands on family life, friends, cause us discomfort or even pain. While suffering is not the goal of discipleship, it may be the price for being a follower of Jesus.

PRAYER:

Lord God, you call us to commit ourselves fully to your kingdom. Grant us the strength, courage and perseverance we need to answer your call. We make these and all our prayers through Christ our Lord. **Amen**
