First Sunday of Advent (Year A) 29th & 30th November 2025

Dear friends.

The new Church Year begins with Jesus' words urging his disciples to live their lives in the certain knowledge that he will come again. As we begin to focus on his first coming as a human being, we ask the Lord to open our hearts to welcome him and his message, to renew our hope, to work through us, to bring his peace, his love and his vision to our world. Vigilance is a key element in our expectation; however, it is a vigilance made visible in a truly Christian life of sacrifice and concern. May this advent keep us alert and open to His light in living out our Christian life.

The Advent Wreath

It was in the western Church that the tradition of the Advent wreath grew. It celebrates the coming of eternal Light into a world "sitting in the darkness and the shadow of death" (LK 1:78). This brightly round wreath expresses our conviction that Christ will always come into the world as its true light.

Symbolism of the Wreath

The circular shape symbolizes the coming of the Lord, in the past in flesh, in the present in grace, in the future in glory. The evergreens are a sign of our hope for salvation. Green is the Church's colour for hope. We are reminded of the everlasting life and love that comes to us from God through Jesus Christ. The candles (three purple and one rose coloured) are the Light, which "shines in the darkness", coming progressively as each week another candle is lit.

The purple candles (for the 1st, 2nd and 4th weeks) symbolize repentance and conversion, clearing away the mountains and filling in the valleys.

The rose coloured candle (3rd week, formerly it was Gaudete Sunday) is a sign of our joy that the Lord is always near.
